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## CHAPTER I

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### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE COMPANIES ORDINANCE"

*(Assented to June 12, 1929)*

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

1. "The Companies Ordinance," being Chapter 18 of the Consolidated Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1914, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section immediately after Section 263 of the said Ordinance:

263-A. Any Company now or hereafter incorporated under this Ordinance shall be deemed to have had from the date of its incorporation, and shall have, power by resolution of the company to sell or dispose of its assets and whole undertaking for such consideration as the company thinks fit, and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other company having objects altogether or in part similar, provided such sale or disposition is one of the objects of the company contained in its memorandum of association.

Company given power to dispose of undertaking.

Shares, etc. may form part consideration.

2. Sub-Section 4 of Section 18 of said Ordinance is amended by striking out the words "give at least one month's previous notice in the Gazette" in the first and second lines of said Sub-Section and inserting the following in lieu thereof: "publish a notice once in the Gazette."

## CHAPTER II

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE VITAL STATISTICS OR ORDINANCE"

(Assented to June 12, 1929)

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

"The Vital Statistics Ordinance", being Chapter 8 of the Consolidated Ordinances Yukon Territory, 1914, is hereby amended by striking out the words "A in the schedule to this Ordinance" in the ninth and tenth lines of Section 8 of the said Ordinance, and by substituting therefor the following: "to be approved by the Territorial Secretary from time to time."

The said Ordinance is further amended by striking out the words "B in the Schedule to this Ordinance" in the fifth and sixth lines of Section 11 of the said Ordinance, and by substituting therefor the following: "to be approved by the Territorial Secretary from time to time"; and by striking out the words "said form B" in the last line of the said Section 11, and by substituting therefor the following "such form".

The said Ordinance is further amended by striking out the words "C in the Schedule to this Ordinance" in the tenth and eleventh lines of Section 12 of the said Ordinance and by substituting therefor the following: "to be approved by the Territorial Secretary from time to time".

## CHAPTER III

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### AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR A BOUNTY ON WOLVES AND COYOTES

*(Assented to June 12, 1929)*

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

(1)

The Commissioner may by Proclamation authorize the payment of a bounty of \$30.00 on each wolf and \$15.00 on each coyote killed in the Yukon Territory; such payment to be made upon delivery over of the skin of the animal to a duly appointed agent of the Government. In such Proclamation the Commissioner may make all necessary regulations for the carrying out of such purpose, and such regulations may be in like manner amended from time to time.

The Proclamation shall be published in one issue of the Gazette, and in one issue of a newspaper published in the Whitehorse and Mayo Districts, and shall come into effect at a date to be named therein.

## CHAPTER IV

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE YUKON GAME ORDINANCE"

(Assented to June 12, 1929)

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

(1)

"The Yukon Game Ordinance", being Chapter 1 of the Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1920, is hereby amended by inserting the following immediately after sub-section 5 of section 4 of the said Ordinance:

No moose or caribou under 1 year to be killed.

(5-A) Any moose or Caribou under the age of one year, at any time.

Sub-section 3-A of section 4 of the Yukon Game Ordinance, as amended by Chapter 5 of the Ordinances of 1924, is amended by striking out the word "July" in the ninth line of said sub-section and substituting the word "May."

## CHAPTER V

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE CROWN GRANT TAX ORDINANCE"

(Assented to June 12, 1929)

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

(1)

"The Crown Grant Tax Ordinance," being Chapter 5 of the Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1919, is hereby amended by adding thereto immediately after section 18 of the said Ordinance, the following sections:



19. If it shall appear that any sale proceedings heretofore taken under the provisions of this Ordinance have been rendered abortive or ineffective by reason of failure to give or to record the necessary instrument of transfer within the time provided by the Land Titles Act, or for any other technical reason, the Collector may take the following special proceedings with respect to any claims so sold or purported to have been sold or forfeited:

Procedure where former sale proceedings abortive.

(a) He may advertise such claims for sale again, stating the names of owners,, descriptions of claims, and amounts due for taxes, penalties and costs of advertising and other expenses, as set forth in the Notice of Sale which was published at the time of the former or abortive sale but including nothing for the cost of the present advertising or proceedings:

Re-advertisement of claims.

(b) Such advertisement shall be inserted once in a newspaper published in the Yukon Territory, at least thirty days before the date set for sale, and shall constitute good and effective service upon all persons holding any interests in said claims.

Publication.

Publication to constitute service.

(c) On the day appointed for the sale, the Collector or his agent shall offer for sale at public auction any of such claims with respect to which the amount so due for taxes, penalties, cost of advertising and other expenses has not been paid, and shall sell each claim separately to the highest bidder therefor. Bids on any claim may be made by or on behalf of the Commissioner up to the amount due as aforesaid.

Procedure at sale.

Commissioner may bid.

(d) If the purchase price shall exceed the amount due as aforesaid the surplus shall be paid in to the Territorial Treasurer by the Collector in trust for the owner or person lawfully entitled thereto.

Treatment of surplus.

(e) After a claim has been so sold there shall be no right to redeem the same by the owner or any other person interested therein.

No right of redemption after sale.

Purchaser to receive receipt.

- (f) The successful bidder for a claim shall forthwith be entitled to a receipt from the Collector setting forth the claim bought by him, and the amount paid, and immediately after the sale has been confirmed by the Court in manner hereinafter provided, shall receive from the Collector a transfer thereof in proper form.

Transfer to purchaser after confirmation.

Application to Court for confirmation

20. Application to confirm such a sale may be made to the Court ex parte at any time after the sale, supported by affidavit of the Collector or his assistant, showing:

- (a) The claims sold at such former or abortive sale, the ownership thereof, the amount of taxes, penalties, cost of advertising charged against each claim at such sale; and the non-payment thereof.

Material required on application.

- (b) That notice of sale was given to the owners of the claims mentioned as provided by subsection 2 of section 5 of the said Ordinance.
- (c) That no instruments of transfer were filed within the time provided by the Land Titles Act in such cases.
- (d) That advertisement was made as provided by subsection (a) of Section 19.

Ratification of former sales in certain instances.

21. Any sales of Crown Granted Mineral Claims heretofore made under the provisions of the said Ordinance, and in respect to which transfers have been registered the Certificates of Title obtained, are hereby ratified and validated.

Operation of Ordinance suspended for years 1930, 1931 and 1932.

The operation of "The Crown Grant Tax Ordinance" and all ordinances in amendment thereof shall be suspended in and during the calendar years 1930, 1931 and 1932. Such suspension shall in no way interfere with, hinder or suspend the carrying out of the provisions of said Ordinance and amending Ordinances so far as con-

cerns the assessment and collection of taxes thereunder for any year from the coming into force of the said Ordinance up to and including the year 1923, and all proceedings and things necessary for the recovery of such taxes for the year last mentioned, or the sale of property for unpaid taxes, and all proceedings and things necessary to be done or that may be done both before and subsequent to any such sale as provided by the said Ordinance and amendments, may be had and done notwithstanding any of the provisions of this Ordinance.

The said "The Crown Tax Ordinance" shall again come into full operation from and after the first day of January, 1933.

## CHAPTER VII

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE BILLS OF SALE ORDINANCE"

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*(Assented to June 12, 1929)*

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of the said Territory, enacts as follows:

Sub-section 4 of Section 10 of the "Bills of Sale Ordinance", being Chapter 7 of the Consolidated Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1914, is hereby amended by adding the words "or bonds" after the word "debentures" in the second and third lines of the said sub-section; and is further amended by adding the words "or at any time prior to the expiration of two years from the day of the registration of the said mortgage or conveyance" after the word "Conveyance" in the eighth line of said sub-section.

## CHAPTER VIII

### AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE HOURS OF LABOUR IN PLACER MINING OPERATIONS.

(Assented to June 12, 1929)

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

(1)

Workers in  
placer mines  
not to be  
employed more  
than 8 hours  
in one day.

No person shall be employed in or about any placer mining operations in the Yukon Territory for a longer period than eight hours in any twenty-four hours, except that when shifts change such person may be employed for whatever longer period may be necessary to make the change.

Not to apply  
to overtime.

(2) Provided that the prohibition herein contained shall not apply to the working of overtime by any such person, at the rate to be agreed upon in writing between employer and employee.

Persons working  
by month not  
included.

(3) The word "person" used herein shall not include any employee who is engaged by the month.

(4) "Twentyfour hours" shall mean from midnight to midnight.

Penalty.

Any owner, agent or manager and anyone acting on behalf of any owner, agent or manager, employing any workman or person in contravention of this Ordinance shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$50.00, nor less than \$10.00 for each workman or person so employed, and every workman or person so working for a longer period than that specified in the preceding section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$50.00 and not less than \$10.00, and costs.

## CHAPTER IX

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE LEGAL PROFESSION ORDINANCE"

(Assented to June 12, 1929)

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

(1)

"The Legal Profession Ordinance" being Chapter 50 of the Consolidated Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1914, is hereby amended by adding immediately after sub-section 3 of section 4 of the said Ordinance the following:

4. Provided that the term of five years called for by this section shall be reduced to three, if previously to having been articulated, the Clerk had attained the degree of bachelor or master of arts or doctor of laws in any recognized university of the United Kingdom or of the Dominion of Canada; and provided further that in such case the preliminary examination shall not be required.

## CHAPTER X

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE SALE OF BEER ORDINANCE"

(Assented to June 12, 1929)

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

Sub-section 1 of Section 20 of "The Sale of Beer Ordinance", being Chapter 2 of the Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1925, is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:

under shall be as fallows:

Dawson 10	In the City of Dawson not more than ten Licenses;
Whitehorse 6	In the Town of Whitehorse not more than six licenses;

Keno 5	In the Community known as Keno City not more than five licenses.

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## CHAPTER XI

AN ORDINANCE FOR GRANTING TO THE COM-  
MISSIONER CERTAIN SUMS OF MONEY TO  
DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE PUBLIC  
SERVICE OF THE TERRITORY AND THE  
CITY OF DAWSON.

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*(Assented to June 12, 1929)*

WHEREAS, It appears by Message from George Ian MacLean, Esquire, the Gold Commissioner of the Yukon Territory and in the Supplementary Estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned in Schedule "A" are required to defray certain further expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory and the City of Dawson and for the purposes relating thereto for the year ended March 31, 1929, and,

WHEREAS, It appears by Message from George Ian MacLean, Esquire, the Gold Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, and in the estimates accompanying the same hereinafter mentioned in Schedule "B" to this Ordinance are required to defray certain expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory and for the purposes relating thereto for the twelve months ending March 31, 1930, and,



WHEREAS, It appears by Message from George Ian MacLean, Esquire, the Gold Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, and in the estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned in Schedule "C" to this Ordinance are required to defray certain expenses of the Public Service of the City of Dawson and for the purpose relating thereto for the twelve months ending March 31, 1930.

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, therefore enacts as follows:

1. From and out of the sums at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall be paid and applied a further sum not exceeding in the whole One Hundred and Sixty-seven Thousand Five Hundred and Eighty-three Dollars and Thirty-eight Cents for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory for the year ending March 31, 1929, as set forth in Schedule "A" to this Ordinance; and from out of the sums at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall be paid and applied a further sum not exceeding in the whole One Thousand Five Hundred and Ninety-four Dollars and Twenty-three Cents for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the City of Dawson for the year ended March 31, 1929, as set forth in Schedule "A" to this Ordinance.

2. From and out of the funds at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall and may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding in the whole Two Hundred and Fifty-six Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-three Dollars and Thirty Cents for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory for the twelve months ending March 31, 1930, as set forth in Schedule "B" to this Ordinance.

3. From and out of the funds at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall and may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding Thirty-four Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the City of Dawson for the twelve months ending March 31, 1930, as set forth in Schedule "C" to this Ordinance.

4. The due application of all moneys expended shall be duly accounted for.

5. In the event of there being a surplus of moneys standing to the credit of any item voted for Roads, Bridges and Public Works after the construction or repairs provided for have been completed to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Works and Buildings, such surplus of moneys shall forthwith on the acceptance of such works or repairs by the Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, be taken from said item and become part of and be added to the amount provided for contingencies to such roads, bridges and public works, and shall thereafter be at the disposal of the Commissioner of the Yukon Territory for Roads, Bridges and Public Works.

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
